

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4K ULTRAHD HDBaseT[™] Extender w/ RS-232, 2-way IR, and POH


2 Basic Operation

Sender unit

The back panel of the Sender unit contains three banks of DIP switches. Each bank contains four DIP switches. These DIP switches control EDID, HPD, HDCP, IR, and HDBT mode. The *default* setting, for each DIP switch, is in the "down" (OFF) position.

Each DIP switch (1 - 12) is arranged from left to right. DIP switches 11 and 12 are not used. Although the DIP switch numbers do not appear on the unit, we have included them for easy reference.

If a DIP switch is in the "up" position, then it is ON. If a DIP switch is in the "down" position, then it is OFF.

1	Local / pass-through EDID	•	ON Allows all video and audio features of the connected device to be passed to the source device.
			OFF (default) Copies the downstream EDID locally in HDBT mode; modifies downstream EDID to support only up to 1080p60 8-bit in Long Reach mode.



Receiver unit

The back panel of the Receiver unit contains three banks of DIP switches. Each bank contains four DIP switches. The *default* setting, for each DIP switch, is in the "down" (OFF) position.

Each DIP switch (1 - 12) is arranged from left to right. DIP switch 7 and 8 are not used. Although the DIP switch numbers do not appear on the unit, we have included them for easy reference.

If a DIP switch is in the "up" position, then it is ON. If a DIP switch is in the "down" position, then it is OFF.

Notes on IR Carrier Signals

When an IR carrier frequency is passed through from the Sender unit to the Receiver unit, or from the Receiver unit to the Sender unit, the carrier signal is not renewed. Any carrier frequency between 30 kHz and 60 kHz is natively passed through.

If the IR carrier signal is stripped at the Sender unit and added at the Receiver unit (or vice versa), then the carrier signal can be set to 38 kHz, 47 kHz, or 56 kHz.

To set the carrier signal frequency on the Sender unit, set DIP switch 5 on the Sender unit to the OFF position and use DIP switches 9 and 10 (Sender) to set the carrier frequency. To set the carrier signal frequency on the Receiver unit, set DIP switch 1 on the Receiver unit to the OFF position and use DIP switches 5 and 6 (Receiver) to set the carrier frequency.

Stripping the IR carrier signal is commonly used when directly connecting an IR cable from the output of one device to the input on another IR device.




Controlling the Source from the Viewing Location

- Connect an IR extender (Gefen part no. EXT-RMT-EXTIRN) to the IR In/Ext port on the Receiver unit. If using an automation system, connect the 3.5mm mini-mono connector from the IR In/Ext port on the Receiver unit to the automation system. IR signals are transmitted over the CAT-5 cable.
- 2. Connect the IR emitter from the **IR Out** port, on the Sender unit, to the IR sensor window on the source device.




Controlling the Display from the Source Location

- Connect an IR extender (Gefen part no. EXT-RMT-EXTIRN) to the IR In/Ext port on the Sender unit. If using an automation system, connect the 3.5mm mini-mono connector from the IR In/Ext port on the Receiver unit to the automation system. IR signals are transmitted over the CAT-5 cable.
- 2. Connect an IR emitter (Gefen part no. EXT-IREMIT) from the **IR Out** port on the Receiver unit to the IR sensor on the display.




Controlling the Source / Display from Different Locations

Verifying the USB Driver


In order to use this product with the Gefen Syner-G[™] software, a USB driver must be installed on the computer that is running the Syner-G[™] software. This driver is automatically installed when the Syner-G[™] Software Suite is installed.

- 1. Download and install the Gefen Syner-G[™] Software Suite. The Syner-G[™] software can be downloaded here: http://www.gefen.com/synerg
- 2. Connect a mini-USB-to-USB cable (not included) from the **USB** port on the front of the Sender or Receiver unit to an available USB port on the computer.
- 3. From the Windows Desktop, click the **Start** button, select **Computer**, then right-click and select **Manage** from the context menu.



- 4. The Computer Management window will open.
- 5. In the left window pane, under **System Tools**, click **Device Manager**.
- 6. In the right window pane, locate **Ports (COM & LPT)**.

The device driver will be displayed. In this case, GTB-UHD-HBT2-S will be displayed. If the USB cable is connected to the Receiver unit, then the device driver will be GTB-UHD-HBT2-R.




Downloading an EDID



This monitoring tab has been designed to give the installer an indication of cable or installation issues that may be present in your HDBaseT[™] 2.0 setup. Information displayed here can help troubleshoot problems that may result in a loss of picture or quality. While a video signal may be displayed while marginal values are being recorded here, intermittent issues, such as EMI interference, can be introduced which may cause a momentary loss of signal. The values displayed below are general guidelines to ensure that a proper signal is being both transmitted and received

The Max Error Rate graph (Transmitter Only) will display the general quality of the signal on the cable being used. The lower the value the better. This is an excellent indicator of general cable quality. If this signal is constantly at 100%, there may be an issue with the cable and replacement using a higher quality cable may be necessary. If using UTP (unshielded twisted pair) cabling, using a high quality STP (shielded twisted pair) may help alleviate issues. If the value of the signal hovers above 80% over time, the link is considered marginal. Although an output signal may be present, the signal may be susceptible to interference that cannot be compensated for and a signal loss may occur. Values below 80% are considered acceptable, and while momentary spikes above the 100% mark may be detected, and average signal that lies below the 80% level is considered good. Values above 80% are recorded.

Link Quality (Transmitter and Receiver, however the Receiver side is considered more important for overall Link Quality evaluation) is displayed as pairs of signals that directly relate to the pair of cables present in the link cable. The higher the value the better. This is an excellent indicator of issues that may be present with a particular pair. Bad termination of cabling may be the cause of issues when a particular pair is showing marginal performance and is constantly dropping below the 38% value. If a particular pair is deviating from all of the others, a re-termination of the cable-end may solve the problem. If all pairs are displaying performance below 38% over time, this is indicative of a bad cable and should be replaced with a higher quality cable. Re-termination of both ends should be considered first if in-field termination was initially performed during installation. Values above 38% are considered acceptable, although a value closer to 100% is preferred. Values below 38% are recorded.

The graphs this tab can be used together to determine the overall quality of the link cable. Environmental forces may also cause momentary spikes in the values, but every effort to compensate for these forces has been taken in the product design, and ensuring that a high quality link cable with proper termination is the best solution to avoiding potential issues. In the event that a high quality cable is being used, and proper cable termination has been verified, environmental issues that cause values to be skewed may be the cause of signal issues. Inordinate amounts of interference can skew the results of these graphs, and the cable's placement in an installation may need to be moved to alleviate these issues.






